<p>Salvation Army</p> <p>Also called Harbor Light Center, the Salvation Army men's shelter provides emergency shelter along with evaluation for long-term shelter, medical screening and referral, and spiritual services. First-time residents need to arrive by 2pm for intake, while returning residents can be back by 4:30pm. Clients must bring a state-issued ID. Clients may arrive by 3pm for intake between 3:30-4:30pm. Only the first 6 women are taken. Dinner and breakfast are provided, and residents must be out by 7am. <p>Sally's House</p> <p>Sally's House is an emergency shelter for women, through the Salvation Army. Clients must arrive by 3pm for intake and must bring some form of ID. Only the first 20 women in line are taken in. Dinner and breakfast are provided. Allowed stay is up to 30 days. Children are NOT allowed. <p>Shelters – Men, Women & Families</p>	
<p>Bay Area Homeless</p> <p>Separate men's and women's dormitories, along with three meals a day. New clients are accepted between 9am and 4pm daily. Individual case management plans are provided shortly after intake. Transportation is provided for job searching processes (employment interviews, resume critiques, on-the-job readiness training). <p>Family Promise of Lake Houston</p> <p>90-120 day Self-Sufficiency Program for homeless families with children. They provide individual counseling, Budget Coach, Life Skills Coach, employment training, Fast Track GED, a two-year After Care Program, overnight accommodations, and meals. All adults must work and participate fully in all aspects of the program. Children will be enrolled in school or a daycare program. They are a sober program. <p>Family Promise of Montgomery County</p> <p>90-day program providing families in need with shelter, meals, transportation, and other assistance. Families are required to work full-time and take the necessary steps to become independent and self-sufficient, while children must be enrolled in school and/or child care programs. <p>Salvation Army</p> <p>Salvation Army's Montgomery County Corps is the only shelter in Montgomery County with overnight lodging for homeless men and women. Short-term financial assistance and social activities are available for low-income families and the elderly. <p>Star of Hope Family</p> <p>Shelter can house up to 300 guests in 71 rooms. Allowed stay is up to 90 days. <p>Mission of Yahweh Emergency and transitional housing. Do not take walk-ins. Individuals must first call and set up an in-person or phone interview. <p>Salvation Army Family Residence Shelter along with a full schedule of classes and counseling designed to address the underlying causes of homelessness and facilitate healing, thereby providing the necessary tools to return to independence (computer instruction, cooking and nutrition, financial planning, health issues, life skills, parenting, etc.). Children have the opportunity to attend field trips, parties, and an educational summer day camp. <p>Bridge Over Troubled Waters The Bridge exists to assist women, children and men in crisis, particularly those who have been affected by domestic violence, sexual assault or homeless situations. They can make referrals and provide information even if you reside outside of Harris County. Women and children are granted initial stay in the emergency shelter for up to 30 days and then may apply for an extension through a caseworker provided they are working on goals. <p>FamilyTime Foundation Free counseling and support groups for victims of abuse, a 24-hour crisis helpline, hospital accompaniment for victims of abuse by trained advocates, legal advocacy about issues stemming from abuse, parenting education and anger management classes. <p>Montgomery County Women's Center Emergency shelter to abused women and children along with individual counseling, legal advocacy, support groups, education and childcare while they begin their healing process and seek employment. Food, clothing, limited medical treatment, and personal care items are also provided. Shelter services are available for a maximum of 45 days with two-week extension if there is an expectation of permanent or transitional housing. Call for shelter access. <p>Covenant House 80-bed emergency shelter available 24-hours for youth in need. Along with shelter, they offer free meals, anonymous and confidential HIV testing, STD testing, HIV prevention counseling and education, job skills programs, mental health services, and substance abuse services.
